

Grading system

With the aim of making the grading systems in the different countries comparable, the ECTS grading system has been created. The ECTS grading system is not replacing the local grading systems, but to supplement those and is being applied in the Transcript of Records. The grading system is defined as follows:

ECTS Grade	Definition
A	EXCELLENT – outstanding performance with only minor errors
B	VERY GOOD – above the average standard but with some minor errors
C	GOOD – generally sound work with a number of notable errors
D	SATISFACTORY – fair but with significant shortcomings
E	SUFFICIENT – performance meets the minimum criteria
FX	FAIL – some more work required before the credit can be awarded
F	FAIL – considerable further work is required

The Kyrgyz grading system is based on numerals, where 5 is excellent, 4 is very good, 4 is good, 3 is satisfactory, and 2 is poor. Passing grades are 3 through 5; 2 denote a failure.

Comparison between the Kyrgyz grading system and the ECTS grading system:
